

Financial Overview

World Emergency Relief

WER remains committed to excellence in quality of program and management of the funds entrusted to us by our donors. In 2019, we used 96% of all donated resources for program expenses. Of our remaining total revenue, only 2.5% was used for fundraising and 1.5% for management costs such as staff salaries and office operating expenses. Our dedicated Board, staff and community volunteers understand that our donors place a special trust and confidence in our stewardship of their donated resources.

Program Overview



Measuring success, one child at a time ...

Our commitment to improving children's lives continues through our two primary outreaches, Native American Emergency Relief & World Emergency Relief. NAER's focus is to improve the lives of Native American's by providing food, blankets, firewood, clean water and agricultural support. WER's emphasis is to deliver food and medical support for children – especially in Africa – and disaster relief here in the US and around the world.

Through these programs, WER & NAER provided nearly \$10 million in food, medicines, hygiene and disaster relief supplies to people in need.

In the past year, WER donors helped us to:

- Deliver 3,879,372 meals to hungry African children
- Provide 328,596 pounds of fresh produce, bottled water & blankets to Native American families
- Supply clinics and hospitals in South Sudan, Sierra Leone and Honduras with life-saving medicines and medical supplies to treat the poor free of charge.
- Send over \$3.1 million of disaster relief supplies to Hurricane Dorian victims in the Bahamas
